


TO COMMEMORATE THE 30th ANNIVERSARY

TRY THE WALK TO COMMEMORATE THE 30TH ANNIVERSARY

Carbon emissions: We keep being told that throughout the world, these are too high and need to be reduced. They are affecting Climate Change, which we have seen by increasing temperatures, flooding, storms and tornado winds.

We can all help reduce our own carbon emissions, but we must look after our Woodland areas too. The trees absorb carbon, as well as provide habitats for our wildlife. So they must be protected.

Our wildflowers attract small insects and Rape Seed crops in season also provide nectar for our bees and food for other insects.

YOUR ROUTE (following the map)

- 1. From the village pond at the junction of Oakley Lane and Hill Road, head for St. John's Road and the entrance to the Multi User Path (Long Break) by the railway bridge, opposite the St. John's burial ground.
- 2. This path is looked after by Jubiloaks, along with other Woodland areas by the Oakley Woodland Group.

There are also opportunities to volunteer to join a working party, if you have a keen interest in the nature around us.

- 3. Continue down Multi User Path (Long Break) to the iron gate on the right. Go through the gate with Wells copse on your left.
- 4. Follow the path, alongside Wells Copse round to Breach Farm House, Breach Cottages and on to Jeffreys Copse on your Left.
- 5. Right at (Fuzzy Drove) through to Puzzle Corner, follow the path to Pardown, cross over into Sainfoin Lane (last right), leading to Hill Road and back to the village pond.

Enjoy the Walk and the lovely woodlands around you.
